
- ⇒ Never bury caches or place caches far off the trail.

- Avoid sensitive areas such as fragile soils, steep slopes, archaeological sites.
- Leave caches only on durable surfaces along existing trails.
- Replace rocks or other natural objects lifted during a search.
- Find routes that minimize impact to natural resources.
- Leave places looking as if the seekers had never been there.
- Check with local land managers before placing a cache.
